The British Museum and the Marsh Charitable Trust are pleased to invite applications for the Marsh Trust Award. This award recognises innovation, dedication and excellence shown by volunteers who engage the public in museums, galleries and heritage sites across the UK.

MARSH Charitable Trust



The Marsh Trust Award is looking for applications which demonstrate the ways in which an individual or group of volunteers have made a difference to their museum or heritage site during 2023, whether through a contribution to their institution, local community or audiences.

Applications are welcomed from museums, galleries, historic houses and heritage sites of all sizes. The award scheme highlights and celebrates volunteers and their important contribution to learning and engagement. The prizes are awarded to the volunteer(s), not the museum. They will be presented at a ceremony at the British Museum on the afternoon of 23 September 2024.

The prizes

- \$500 and a certificate awarded to a winner from each region – one from each of the nine English regions, and one each from Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- £2,000 awarded to an overall winner selected from the regional winners.

The criteria

- We are looking for applications which demonstrate that an individual volunteer or a small group of volunteers have enhanced visitors' learning and enjoyment.
- The volunteering activity can take place within the museum or off-site, or contribute to an online project that supports learning.
- Applications should focus on the achievements of a specific volunteer or a small team. The prizes are awarded to the volunteer(s), not the museum.
- The volunteering highlighted in the application form must have taken place during 2023.

Who can enter?

- An individual or small group of volunteers who engage with the public in a museum, gallery or heritage site.
- Multiple individuals or small groups of volunteers from the same museum or gallery are welcome to apply.
- Volunteers can nominate themselves but they must have the support of their organisation.
- A museum may enter on behalf of an individual volunteer or group of volunteers.
- British Museum volunteers are not permitted to apply.

How to enter

- Simply complete the application form on the next page, or download it at britishmuseum.org/marshaward
- In addition to the application form, please provide a short description of the voluntary activity you are nominating for an award (maximum 250 words).
- Briefly describe how the volunteer(s) have enhanced the museum experience for visitors or made a difference to their heritage site (maximum 250 words).
- Include examples of positive feedback from visitors, museum staff and/or local community members.
- Include up to five photographs related to the volunteer activity and/or your site. Include a leaflet about your museum if you have one.
